- Wrote the feature "Transit", commissioned by MTV Networks Europe, directed by Niall MacCormick, produced by Tigerlily Films (UK), shot in Los Angeles, Saint Petersburg, Mexico City and Nairobi, and broadcast worldwide by MTV. The film was voted 'Best Popular Feature' at the One World Media Awards (London, 2006)
- "The Tale of the Rat that Wrote", written by Murilo and directed by Billy O'Brien, was nominated for a 'Best Short Film' BAFTA Award, and won the top prize at the San Francisco, Nashville, Bucheon, Cork, Foyle and Oporto festivals (1999/2000). As a consequence, Murilo was formally invited to and became a full member of both the British Academy of Film and Television Arts and the European Film Academy
- Wrote and directed the shorts "Sniffers", "Future via Hope", "Cold Heart" and "Branka". "Sniffers" was shown across the UK at Oasis theatres preceding the main feature presentation; it also was selected for a world tour of leading festivals sponsored by the British Council. "Future via Hope" was among the winners of the 'Visions' contest ran by Channel 5 UK; it was nominated 'Best Short' at the British Advertising Craft Awards
