The long running Channel 4 medical series for the first time features life inside Queen's Medical Centre, Nottingham - one of the busiest major trauma centres in the country.

Ambulance [Series 7], BBC1 (Dragonfly) – Senior Edit Producer: 6 x 60 mins.

The popular medical series following the North West Ambulance Service saving lives on the NHS frontline. I worked alongside the Executive Producer planning the edit for the series.

2020: (Selected Credits)

'Britain's Puppy Boom: Counting the Cost', BBC3 (Nine Lives Media) –

Co-Executive Producer: 45 mins.

This documentary explores the growing phenomenon of dog breeding and ownership amongst young people in Covid-hit Britain.

Marcus Rashford: Feeding Britain's Children, BBC1 – Producer: 60 mins.

This fly-on-the-wall documentary follows Manchester United and England footballer, Marcus Rashford during his high-profile campaign to end child food poverty.

David Jason: Britain's Favourite TV Star, Channel 5 (ITN Productions) –

Producer/Director: 90 mins.

This tribute to the life and career of Sir David Jason features interviews with his co-stars and tells the inside story behind his greatest hits, featuring rarely seen archive footage.

Claimed and Shamed [Series 13], BBC1 (Curve Media) – Series Producer: 15 x 45 mins.

Series Producer for the popular daytime insurance fraud series. I oversaw all aspects of the production, addressing any legal and compliance issues.

Little Britons [Series 1], Channel 5 (Nine Lives Media) – Series Producer/Director: 3 x 60 mins.

This observational documentary series followed the lives of people with the rare genetic condition of dwarfism, whose height gives them a unique perspective on life in Britain.

Self-shot documentary filmed over the course of a year delved into the conflict between bailiffs and the grassroots activists seeking to prevent people being evicted from their homes.

This headline making undercover investigation exposed the rise in drunken disruptive behaviour on airplanes, and asked whether UK airports were to blame.

Landmark documentary presented by Sue Barker commemorating 50 years of BBC Two sport, featuring interviews with an array of sporting superstars and celebrities.
