### employment - 2002 to the present day

Since 2002, I have worked for Landmark Films – a documentary production company based in Oxford: <a href="www.landmarkfilms.com">www.landmarkfilms.com</a> Landmark's output has ranged from blue chip factual ob-doc like a BBC2 series on child craniofacial surgery ("Compulsive viewing" according to *The Guardian* and "this dazzling series" according to *The Sunday Times*) through fact ent type films like Channel 4's **Fat Pets** or Channel 5's **Hairy Women** to knockabout, offbeat, more authored films for BBC1's 10.35pm slot, like **Hedge Wars**, **Rat Attack**, **Fox Wars**, **Litter Wars**, **Strange Pets** etc. There are many films and series I'm very proud of but I was especially pleased with:

- BBC2's Brain Doctors series about the work of the brain surgery teams at Oxford's John Radcliffe Hospital. "Fascinating and moving," according to the Mail; "Prepare to be mesmerised", The Sun; "Life-affirming" Sunday Times. Commissioning editors for BBC were Charlotte Moore/Maxine Watson.

A tricky one, given two of the films had to follow Hertfordshire's head of child protection for an ITV pre-watershed slot. *The Times* wrote: "The women emerge as so passionate, committed and humane that frankly, if I ran the service, I'd feel like cloning them." Commissioning editors Peter Fincham/lan Squires.
- C4's **The Strangest Village in Britain**, part of the BAFTA award-winning **Only Human** series. "Both inspiring and strange to watch" according to the *Daily Telegraph*. "Fascinating and inspiring" according to the *Financial Times*. "Funny, touching and profoundly humane," according to *The Times*. This was another

### employment - 1982 to 1996

...is, of course, ancient history. Briefly, I read Politics, Philosophy and Economics at Balliol College, Oxford and then trained as a print journalist on the Sheffield daily papers, working through the miners' strike. I became a crime reporter and then an investigative journalist for the Sheffield evening paper and then an investigative producer for BBC Radio 4 and then joined ITV's **This Week** strand. This was useful as it gave me a good grounding in law, standards of proof and fairness. Then I joined the BBC, eventually directing my first BBC1 **Inside Story** in 1994 – for which I won a Golden Gate award at the San Francisco Film Festival.

#### experience with broadcasters

I've got a lot of BBC experience, where the commissioning editors I've worked with and who know me best are Charlotte Moore, Maxine Watson, and Sam Anstiss. I know lots of others too, but those are probably the best for references. I am also very well used to dealing with BBC legal and ed pol. At ITV, I have worked a lot and have good relationships with Richard Klein and with Andrew O'Connell. At Sky, I know Celia Taylor and Siobhan Mulholland. Channel 4: I've made and execced some of my best films for them (Strangest Hotel in Britain, Fat Pets, Strangest Village in Britain) but at Landmark I found it so difficult to get commissions there so I don't have so much recent experience. People who know me there are Amy Flanagan and Liam Humphreys.
