In summer 2023, Brennig directed a short film as part of the 'It's My Shout' scheme, titled Back to the Romance, which received its premier on BBC Wales later that the year. Brennig 2nd short film, Bare Shelves, is currently doing the festival circuit.

Brennig was shortlisted for the BBC Wales Writer in Residence before being accepted onto the 2021-22 BBC Writersroom Drama Group. While being a member of the group, Brennig was part of the CBBC 'The Dumping Ground' Shadow Writing Scheme and took part in the BBC 'Casualty' Writer Development Program.

Brennig's other notable achievements include winning the 2021 Bluecat Screenwriting Contest Fellini Award for best international screenplay for his feature screenplay 'Cwtch' and being a top three finalist in the Final Draft Big Break Screenplay Awards. He also won the Gold Prize at the 2015 Page International Screenwriting Awards and placed in the semi-finals of the Academy's Nicholls Fellowship.
