

John Walsh is a double BAFTA and double Grierson-nominated filmmaker, best-selling author and founder of <u>Walsh Bros Ltd</u>, one of the UK's top 100 production companies. John met Ray Harryhausen as a film student to make a documentary about his life and work. Today, John is a Trustee of the <u>Ray & Diana Harryhausen Foundation</u> and, in 2021, founded the <u>Harryhausen Awards</u>.

John's books include <u>Harryhausen: The Lost Movies</u> and his acclaimed non-fiction Official Story of the Film series for Titan Books with titles on <u>Flash Gordon</u>, <u>Escape From</u> <u>New York</u> and <u>Dr Who & The Daleks</u>. All four Rondo Award Nominees for "Book of the Year". 2023 saw the release of <u>Conan The Barbarian</u> and <u>The Wicker Man</u>. 2024 saw the publication of <u>The Third Man: The Official Story</u> of the Film, celebrating the 75th anniversary of "The best British film of all time." New books in 2025: <u>Gladiator II: The Art</u> and <u>Making of the Ridley Scott Film</u> from Abrams Books and in 2026: <u>The Texas Chain</u> <u>Saw Massacre: The Official Story of the Film</u>.

John's notable film work includes the historical feature film <u>Monarch</u>, restored and remastered after John tracked down the original 35mm camera negative in a film vault and was the subject of a <u>BBC News</u> story about lost films and is now available on <u>Prime</u> <u>Video</u>.

His documentary work includes <u>ToryBoy The Movie</u>, which was nominated for the Grierson Award for "Best Documentary on a Contemporary Theme." The film opened politics to a broad audience and is Britain's most successful political documentary feature film. It is now available on <u>Prime Video.</u>

John's Grierson-nominated landmark series <u>Headhunting The Homeless</u> for BBC2 lifted the lid on the corporate world and today's most vulnerable adults. <u>Sofa Surfers</u> for the BBC was television's first homeless series for children and was Rose d'Or-nominated. The BAFTA-nominated <u>Don't Make Me Angry</u> brought clinical psychology into the home environment for the first time.
