BRIEF HISTORY AFTER SCHOOL & UNIVERSITY

Following University, Mike worked in a number of fields, including marine biology surveys and research work in Watamu on the Kenya Coast, scuba diving instruction on the Kenya coast, aerial photography and habitat mapping, commercial stills photography and environmental journalism.

FILM INDUSTRY:

Mike is an accomplished director and cinematographer of international television wildlife documentary films and docu-dramas and has won numerous international awards over the years in recognition of his diverse talents as a filmmaker.

Mike has a varied set of skills gathered over many filmmaking disciplines over the years, and loves the fact that AfriScreen provides him with opportunity to carry out all the aspects of filmmaking that he enjoys. He conceptualizes, writes, shoots, edits, plans the complex logistics for remote location shoots and track-lays the music mixes for our films.



Mike Holding began his 23-year career in the communications field as a second unit cameraman for BBC Television News in Kenya in 1978. He filmed news footage of the Ugandan and Somali civil wars and a number of documentary programme inserts in several other African countries. This 18-month commission was followed by a year of commercial and industrial still photography in Nairobi, after which he moved to South Africa, shortly to take over as Editor of two successful leisure magazines – Great Outdoors and SA Boating.

After three years, he became involved as a director in corporate audio-visual and industrial theatre, first with Audio Image in Johannesburg, then as owner and Director of Audio Visual Creations, and subsequently as a Creative Director at Multivisio in Johannesburg. Mike then formed award-winning Catchlight Pictures, which undertook high-end blue chip corporate films for four years.

During this period, Mike honed his practical skills as director/producer, cameraman, video editor and audio engineer, personally undertaking all these aspects of his corporate films for over 40 blue chip clients including Coca-Cola, BMW, Mercedes Benz, SA Breweries, Nissan, Toyota and the United Nations Development Programme.

In 1993 he was awarded a 3-year commission as wildlife cameraman, for what was then one of the world's only current 35mm wildlife documentary productions, produced by Tim Liversedge Productions for National Geographic Television on location in Botswana. Mike subsequently edited the off-line cut for this film, "Okavango - Savage Paradise". Thereafter Mike was commissioned by Liversedge and Partridge Films to off-line edit the one hour, 35mm documentary "Painted Wolves of the Okavango" produced for National Geographic TV, for which he also has cameraman credits.

After forming AfriScreen Films with Producer Tania Jenkins, he worked on the development of complex interactive wildlife scenes for feature film "Manna" (in development, Talisman Films, UK), directed numerous children's environmental inserts for K-TV during 1996/97 (which won AfriScreen some NTVA awards). He also directed and edited a 78-minute series for the Botswana Government Department of Tourism.

Mike was D.O.P. for Marathon Productions (France) on two episodes of the wildlife documentary series "In Care of Nature" ('97) and "Natures Babies" ('98), both featuring Wild Dogs, filmed on location in the Okavango. Also during 1998 he was cameraman for the ITV docu-drama series "Wild Track". In 1999 he worked as wildlife advisor and cameraman on sequences for Green Umbrella's prestigious production, "Triumph of Life", (W-NET / PBS) and as cameraman on sequences for Tigress Productions new "Man-Eaters" series. He also shot recreations and natural history film sequences for the Tigress Productions film on snakes, "Africa's Deadly Dozen".

Mike is currently completing post production on a Natural World film "A Wild Dog's Story", an independent commission from BBC NHU of a story put together by himself and Tania Jenkins, which Mike filmed and produced and Tania produced.

While filming the Natural World film in 2000 and 2001, Mike also filmed sequences for several other productions for the BBC, Tigress Productions and Green Umbrella (full list below).



Although he prefers a low-key approach to such things, his corporate work has been recognised by a number of Lourie Creative Awards for 'Direction' and 'Cinematography'. The film "Haunt of the Fishing Owl" which he co-scripted with Brian Jackman for National Geographic TV, has to date won several international Wildlife Film Festival Awards, while "Okavango-Savage Paradise", for which Mike filmed a significant proportion of the footage, was a selected finalist in the Cinematography Category at the Jackson Hole Wildlife film festival.

AfriScreen Films continues Mike's involvement in wildlife and documentary film, with the aim of utilising his all-round skills for international television documentary and docudrama productions.

Mike is a full member of the IWAF - International Association of Wildlife Filmmakers and is also an elected member of the South African Society of Cinematographers (S.A.S.C). Mike was recently chairman of the newly formed Wildlife Filmmakers Association of Southern Africa.

Born and raised in Kenya, Mike has a BSc. honours degree in Zoology, a Diploma in Business Management, is a keen naturalist and outdoorsman, holds a private pilots license, scuba diving instructors license, hang-gliding license, is an active conservationist, and has travelled very widely throughout Africa's wilderness regions for over 25 years.
