I am an Award-Winning Series Producer & Director, with fifteen years experience making blue-chip observational documentaries, specialist factual films and formats for the BBC and Channel 4. Specialising specifically in first series, I have a reputation for taking projects on from inception and seeing them through to final delivery. This often involves researching complex and sensitive subject matter, developing and maintaining access - particularly in large institutions, finding strong characters, cultivating relationships, and creating powerful stories that are consistent with editorial intentions. I'm also an established broadcast camera operator, with strong visual sensibilities and extensive experience working independently in the UK and overseas. I'm used to handling substantial budgets and managing large teams, from pre-production right through to post.
