My first feature film ALMOST ADULT is about two children who, escaping civil war, seek asylum in the UK.

My second feature film NO WAY HOME is about a 10-year-old boy who convinces himself that an injured man hiding out in a shipping container is his returning father.

Projects in development:

Road Movie / Rights of Passage:

FATIMA'S JOURNEY – FATIMA (78) has advanced TB and osteoporosis has bent her forward to half her true height. She lives with her daughter-in-law and grandchild in a small mountain village in the shadow of the Hindu Kush, Afghanistan. She is speaking to her son, who works on a building site in Kabul. An explosion is heard and the line goes dead. She decides to go and find him. On foot, over mountains and through Taliban controlled Afghanistan, she makes her way to far away Kabul.

Action / Thriller / Drama

BREAKING POINT – Frank (65) is angry at the world, his country has gone to the dogs and he blames it on immigration. When his car is stolen and the police have more important crimes to solve, it's the last straw. Frank decides that he must uphold the law and bring the criminal to justice. But when he kidnaps Mo (17), the teenager responsible, he becomes the criminal and is forced to face his own past wrongs.

Science Fiction / Thriller:

COLONIZE - Colonize is a sci-fi noir thriller about Blake, an Ai psychologist, who works with a sentient system that becomes infected with an alien virus. The virus's goal is to prepare humanity for a 'meta invasion', a speed of light 'upload' from a neighbouring star. When Blake's asks too many questions, his colleague is murdered and he becomes the next target.. the clock is ticking.

Horror / Thriller:

BLACK DOG - Winston Churchill coined the phrase BLACK DOG to describe his PTSD, the feeling of being stalked by a wolf in the shadows. Carson (30) is haunted by 2 tours of duty in Afghanistan. His truck breaks down on an isolated Forest road. From the trees emerges a Black Wolf; from his mind a past he cannot reconsile. Once again, he is in battle for his life, and his soul.
